Sermon Notes:

### Passage: Mark 11:12-14, 19-21

Is this story about Jesus anger? Is it about faith? What is going on?

This story is actually set in the last week of Jesus life before He is crucified. The story before is <u>Jesus triumphal entry</u> into Jerusalem where people are declaring him king. The story in between is him going to the temple and declaring judgement on it.

**The fig tree represents Israel.** In the Old Testament the fig tree often stood as a symbol for the nation of Israel . Hosea 9:10

Cursing the fig tree was Jesus's way(metaphor) of saying that nations spiritual leaders had become spiritually barren before the Lord. They had the form of religion but not the reality. They knew the right words to say, but their hearts were far from God.

Essentially, the tree was a picture of **false advertising**, having leaves but no figs.

**What is the application to this?** God is looking for fruitful lives, not just the appearance of fruit.

God is never put off by our sin. What he is put off by is our pride

# Passage: Mark 11:22-25

Jesus made it clear that prayer must be offered in faith, and faith must be in God. Faith is <u>trust, confidence, and reliance</u>

Jesus is really encouraging us here that when we have faith in the God. In the miracle maker. Really anything is possible. He is a God of miracles.

I don't think that he is saying. 'If you pray hard enough and *really believe*, God is obligated to answer your prayer no matter what you ask.' That kind of faith is not faith in God; rather it is nothing but **faith in faith, or faith in feelings**." (Wiersbe)

"the purpose of prayer isn't to get man's will done in heaven, but God's will done on earth."

forgiveness for those around me is also connected to answered prayer.

God is concerned about our earthly relationships here. When we hold unforgiveness, grudges, hard feelings it creates a block between us and God.
